VOLUNTEER JOB DESCRIPTIONS

Below are the job descriptions of each area requiring volunteers. We ask that you choose no more than a **MAXIMUM OF THREE (3) AREAS OF INTEREST**. Each area has a corresponding number on the application that follows these job descriptions. Please make your selections with a 1,2, or 3 in order of preference. **VOLUNTEERS UNDER THE AGE OF 21 YEARS OLD ARE NOT ALLOWED TO VOLUNTEER IN THE BAR, VIP, BACKSTAGE, AND THE TICKET BOOTH AREAS.**

1. VIP Area

The VIP area can be extremely busy at times and requires volunteers who are able to take in and process a lot of information, and who are able to troubleshoot issues while maintaining a positive helpful attitude.

Duties includes:

- Meet and greet sponsors, dignitaries, and high-level pass holders as they arrive
- Monitoring VIP area
- Communicate information to guests and assist with their needs
- Answer questions and addressing concerns within VIP area
- Monitoring the status of VIP areas and alerting facilities if needed
 (i.e. overflowing trashcans, toilet paper re-stock, wiping down tables)
- People with strong communication and high-end customer service/hospitality skills
- Acute multitasking skills and know how to prioritize
- NO TEENS!!!

2. <u>Kid Zone Area</u>

Duties includes:

- Check-in children ages 5 to 12 who are presented by parent/guardian
- Assuring that parent/guardian and child(ren) have coordinating wristbands or individual tickets
- Ride operators will not check wristbands; their responsibility is the safety of the children using equipment
- Check on height restrictions (minimums) for each inflatable, and then monitor line to make sure children who will not be admitted are not waiting needlessly in line
- Help children with their craft activities by assisting with painting, gluing, using scissors and handling other supplies/equipment that maybe too difficult for younger children
- Maintain a clean and organized activity area

3. Ticket Booth Area

Preferred skills:

Volunteers with working knowledge and/or experience as a cashier.

Duties includes:

- Capability of handling cash, credit cards, and electronic devices for transactions with customers
- Resolve customer complaints, guide them and provide relevant information
- Maintain clean and tidy checkout areas
- Keep record of transactions
- Pleasantly deal with customers to ensure satisfaction
- Ability to deal with crowds and give directions to the public

Shifts: 10am-2pm; 12pm-4pm; 2pm-6pm; 6pm-10pm

Vols per shift: 7

4. Admission Gate Area

This position will involve frequent standing and some traffic control

Line Management Duties:

- Check to ensure that points of entry for each line are clear and understandable
- That people are standing in the correct lines
- Make sure patrons have the correct ticket for their purchase and instruct them to exchange the ticket for a wristband
- Reminding patrons that there will be no re-entry back into the park without purchasing a new ticket

Wristband Exchange Duties:

- Exchange the correct ticket for the correct color wristband and place tickets in the correct slot box
- Volunteer must not give wristbands directly to the patron. Every ticket must have a face attached to it, and the wristband must be placed directly on the wrists of all patrons
- Direct patron to entry of festival grounds

5. Media Area

Check in press/media

Assist in guiding artist to press/media area

Shifts: 2pm-4pm Vols per shift: 1



6. Backstage Area

Hospitality Duty:

- Assisting artists as needed and being hospitable to the artists
- Assuring refreshments/food are available to artists from inside the hospitality tent and managing the setup, operations, and cleaning of the hospitality tent.
- Escort artist to backstage area

Dates: June 22 and 23 Shifts: 2pm-4pm; 3pm-10pm

Vols per shift: 4

7. Bar Area

Preferred skills:

Volunteers with working experience as a bartender and knowledge of mixing and garnishing alcohol beverages

Requirements:

- Must be 21 years or older
- Good customer service skills
- Basic math skills and can handle cash

Duties include:

- Preparing and mixing ingredients for alcohol beverages for patrons
- Interacting with customers, taking orders and serving drinks
- Capability of handling cash, credit cards, and electronic devices for transactions with customers
- Distributes drink tickets and wristbands
- Must be able to deal with crowds and give directions to the public
- Restock/replenish bar inventory & supplies while maintaining an organized, stocked & clean area at all times
- Comply with all food and beverage regulations.
- Assist with set up of bar area and maintain bar lounge area free of debris/garbage and tables are cleaned.
- Requires the ability to lift and/or move up to 40 pounds. Assists with simple tear down at the conclusion of the event day.

8. Concession Area

Preferred skills:

Working knowledge and/or experience as a cashier is ideal

Duties include:

- Capability of handling cash, credit cards, and electronic devices for transactions with customers
- Must be able to deal with crowds and give directions to the public
- Resolve customer complaints, guide them and provide relevant information
- Maintain clean and tidy checkout areas
- Keep record of transactions of non-alcoholic beverages (water, juice), Icees, popcorn, cotton candy and ices sold
- Pleasantly deal with customers to ensure satisfaction

Shifts: 10am-2pm; 12pm-4pm; 2pm-6pm; 6pm-10pm

Vols per shift: 10

9. Vendor Area

Duties include:

• Checking-in all sponsors and vendors at a drive-in tent and directing the sponsors and vendors to their assigned position in the park.

Dates: June 22 and 23

Shifts: 10am-2pm; 12pm-4pm; 2pm-6pm; 6pm-10pm

Vols per shift: 1

10. General Volunteer Area

General assistance volunteers will be assigned to work directly with an event staff member during their hours of service.

Position: Runner/Floater

Duties will vary considerably and will be based on need throughout the festival to fill in the gaps, run errands, or even take over a role for someone who did not show up.

Shifts: 10am-2pm; 12pm-4pm; 2pm-6pm; 6pm-10pm



Position: Surveyors

Duties include gathering demographic information from attendees of festival. Assuring devices being used to gather information is working properly. Some basic technologic knowledge is required.

Position: Festival Set Up Crew Member

Qualifications & Requirements

- Positive attitude
- Ability to follow instructions
- Able to work well independently or in a group
- Physically able to do manual labor

Duties & Responsibilities

- Work under the direction of Event Leaders
- Various set up activities could include but not limited to:
 - Setting up tables and chairs
 - o Hanging or erecting signage
 - Decorating
- Running errands

Position: Festival Tear Down & Clean Up Crew Member Duties & Responsibilities

- Various tear down activities could include but not limited to:
 - o Removing all signage

- Cleaning various areas inside and outside

VOLUNTEER CODE OF CONDUCT

Failure to follow any of the program rules is grounds for expulsion a volunteer for the Chicago Jerk Festival.

- Check-in at the Volunteer Tent, located near admissions gate before reporting to your assigned area and check-out at the Volunteer Tent after you have completed your shift. Your signed volunteer slip MUST be returned after each shift.
- Wear your volunteer t-shirt/badge/wristband while on duty and ONLY while on duty.
- Remain on duty until the end of your shift. Check-out with your Volunteer Coordinator before leaving your post.
- Use of alcohol or controlled substances before or while on duty is NOT allowed. Any
 volunteer suspected of using or being under the influence of drugs or alcohol while on duty
 will be removed from the Chicago Jerk Festival
- Children, friends, family members, and/or pets may NOT accompany you on your volunteer shift.
- Harassment is NOT allowed. It is not permissible to harass others on the basis of their gender, age, race, color, national origin, religion, marital status, citizenship, disability, sexual orientation, or other personal characteristics.
- Volunteers must comply with all security-related instructions.
- No one is allowed to set up or reserve areas in front of stages before the public gates open at 11:00am. Volunteers must adhere to the same prohibition list as the general public.

THINGS TO KEEP IN MIND

- Positions are outdoors and require traversing the Festival Grounds. Dress comfortably and appropriately. Comfortable clothes, shoes (preferably closed-toed), sunscreen, hats, and rain gear are encouraged. Provocative, revealing, or offensive attire while on duty is not appropriate.
- Food will be provided to volunteers who complete their entire shift. Water will be located at each area for volunteers
- During the Festival portable restroom facilities will be available for volunteer use.
- Bags and backpacks may be no larger than 12" x 10" x 17". Though volunteers can leave personal
 items in the Volunteer Tent Area, actual storage space for personal items is not available and the
 Chicago Jerk Festival, their officers, officials, agents, and/or employees, other participants,
 sponsoring agencies, sponsors, advertisers, and if applicable, owners and lessors are not held
 responsible for any lost or damaged personal items.
